## The Rules:

Spot the species of bees and flowers to mark off each cell of the hive  
Make it across the board with 5 in a row. First to finish wins!

**What you will need:**  
A pen/pencil or some sticky dots  
A great pair of peepers

The board consists of a central brown hexagon labeled **FREE**, surrounded by yellow hexagons, which are further surrounded by red hexagons. Each hexagon contains either a bee illustration, a flower illustration, a crown icon, or text describing a bee species or flower.

**Queen Cells (Crown icons):**

- Top: **QUEEN**  
Any species you can tell by their size!
- Right: **QUEEN**  
Any species you can tell by their size!
- Bottom: **QUEEN**  
Any species you can tell by their size!

**Imposter Cells (Red background):**

- Center: **WASP**
- Bottom-right: **HOVERFLY**

**Bee Species:**

- Top: Tree bumblebee  
Brown thorax, black abdomen and a white tail
- Left: White-tailed bumblebee  
Yellow and black bands and a white tail
- Center-left: Honeysuckle
- Center-right: Hairy-footed flower bee  
Jet-black body and orange back legs
- Bottom-left: Common carder bee  
Mainly brown, of varying shades
- Bottom-center: Honey bee  
Long, slim and makes honey!
- Bottom-right: Leafcutter bee  
Looks like a honey bee but cuts semi-circles from leaves

**Flower Species:**

- Top-right: Dahlia
- Right: Oxeye Daisy
- Left: Foxglove
- Bottom-left: Sunflower
- Bottom-center: Buddlija
- Bottom-right: Lavender
