# Reception





### Year One Vauxhall Class











# **Year 3 Waterloo Class**




I've really enjoyed learning about Marcus Rashford– Jacob.



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#### Year 4 Southwark Class

During Black History month we researched various STEM figures of African and Caribbean descent. After having a discussion abut space, we realised that we don't **typically** associate black women with space. We then learnt about Katherine Johnson's invaluable contributions to STEM. She *figured out the paths for the spacecraft to orbit (go around) Earth and to land on the Moon.* NASA used Katherine's maths, and it worked! NASA sent astronauts into orbit around Earth. Later, her maths helped send astronauts to the Moon.

After learning about Katherine Johnson we designed some book titles that would represent her achievements .











Year 4 Southwark made straw rockets to investigate how changing the launch angle of a straw rocket changes the flight trajectory.

Katherine's job was. Autumn


Black History Month is important as it allows us to celebrate everybody's achievements. Gus W





#### London Bridge Class




